As she read the list, she couldn't help but laugh at the way the events of 2020 ransacked those goals. She continued to laugh as she reflected upon how the opposite of those goals happened. Her list was made up of: make more money (she's been unemployed since March); travel more; lose weight; be more social; cry less; and spend more time with her grandmother. Her grandmother died this past year. There is obviously nothing funny about that. But then again, her laugh wasn't really a light hearted one, it was more of a I have to laugh or I will cry type of laugh, and she did make a goal to cry less. At the end of her video I was left longing to just reach through and give her a big hug and hold her till the silent tears found voice and till that voice found peace. I wonder what her goals will look like for the year 2021.

This past year has served as a reminder that life is unpredictable. Sometimes when we find ourselves in chronically unpredictable circumstances we just throw our hands up in the air and say, "what's the point anyways." I re-shared a post on Facebook the other day that said, "I need to get back in shape but I'm kind of waiting to see if the world is going to end before I put any real effort in." Now that produced a light hearted laugh. In the meantime, I just get more and more unhealthy as the world continues to spin on. The danger of unpredictable circumstances is they can produce a mentality of apathy within us.

If there is one resolution I would love to see you (and me) strive for, it is to not stop caring. Don't stop caring about living your dreams. Don't stop caring about losing weight and being healthier. Don't stop caring about staying connected to friends and family. Don't stop caring, above all, about staying connected to your church and staying connected to God. If the world has shown us unpredictability, celebrating another Christmas has shown us stability. This continued faith in and service to God is the very reason we have hope and a reason to care no matter what the future brings.

Similar to what Dorothy from "The Wizard of Oz" famously said, "My! People come and go so quickly here!", I will say, "My! 2020 came and went so quickly!" I cannot believe that 2020 has come and gone! Over the last year, we have seen a lot of changes and tried new things. Some of us tried new hairstyles... or lack thereof in my case. We learned a different way of being the church in a time when we could not meet in-person. We learned how to share the love of Christ on

new platforms and medias. We learned that loving our neighbors does not always mean the person across the street or around the corner.

As a church, we said "good-bye" to a pastor who had been with us for a very long time. We also said "hello" and "welcome" to the youngest and first female pastor of our church. We welcomed the footsteps of new "PK's" or pastor's kids. Thanks to numerous volunteers, we launched streaming our worship services online – reaching people right where they are – in their cars, homes, and workplaces - all with the touch of a screen or computer mouse. The work of the church kept on going because we answered the clarion call placed on our lives: to do all the good you can, for all the people you can, for as long as you can.

As human beings, it's all too often a lot easier to be stuck in our negative emotions. It's easier to focus on all that is wrong, to complain, and be miserable. We like to have those conversations with others where we commiserate on our collective misery. BUT – I do not believe that is what we are called to do.

Yes – last year was different, but Jesus calls us to be different and to do something different. Paul lays it out very simply and clearly in his first letter to the church in Thessalonica when he writes, "Rejoice always!"

At the advent of each year, many of us create New Year's Resolutions. I personally take part in the pledging and writing of New Year's Resolutions every year – sometimes successful, and sometimes not.

One researcher found that only 18% of us will keep those resolutions. What are your resolutions for 2021? Some of mine include being more attentive to others, enjoying more time with my children, and taking time to relax.

If you have not made a resolution yet, I have a suggestion: Be more joyful! What do you have to be joyful about as we start a new year? What is bringing you joy right now? For me, I've found joy in the simple things like being able to spend a lot more time with my kids who are teenagers and are nearing the age of adulthood. I have found joy in the times when my partner and I dance to the theme song of "The Great British Baking Show." I have found joy in the silence when I am in my den, quietly reading the word of God.

Joy – it is there if only we take the time to look for it. 2020 was long, and while we will remember it as the year of COVID-19, social distancing, and wearing masks, I challenge you to ponder what has brought you joy – to think about it – to dream about it. And then, once you've done that, figure out ways to bring joy to others. We are called to rejoice. Always. No exceptions. Amen.

The SUMC congregation, with help from some community members, provided 78 coats, along with some cold weather accessories, for the City of Pittsburgh Police distribution in Northview Heights Housing. - Additionally, gifts were purchased for 20 residents of The Bradley Center, a residential mental health treatment facility for children age 6 to 21 located in Robinson Township. In addition to the wonderful, personalized gifts provided by congregants and friends, each of the 20 SUMC sponsored children also received a plush throw blanket.
- Lastly, SUMC, along with community partners, provided bagged meals on December 21st and 23rd to the nurses of the Heritage Valley Sewickley COVID and ICU units. On December 21st, Subway (Leetsdale) provided subs at reduced cost, which were then packed with water, chips, fruit and Hostess holiday snack cakes. On December 23rd, Safran's provided sandwiches, also at reduced cost, which were then sent along with Smiley Christmas Tree Cookies donated by Eat'n Park (Sewickley), chips, water, and fruit. Every meal bag contained at least one note of appreciation, thanks to the congregants who provided those well wishes. Not long after the December 21st meals were taken to the hospital, a member of the respiratory care team called the church to express appreciation for the meal provided. Funding for this project was primarily provided through Miracle Sunday. In such difficult times, it was a blessing to be able to work alongside others in the Sewickley community. While a third Christmas week meal was planned for the nurses, SUMC was asked to postpone that until January, when it is expected that the COVID unit will have even more patients. Outreach decided that not only will SUMC provide that meal but will plan for two additional bagged meals in mid- to late-January. If you did not have the opportunity to write a note of appreciation and well wishes for the nurses in December, you are welcome to drop off notes in early January to be included with the meals that will be sent to the nurses in January.

Let's make this our sunset prayer for the first Sunday in January 2021. From wherever you are, with whomever might join you, at around 5 p.m. on **January 3**, lift a prayer of response, of service, of self-confidence. Send us, Lord. Show us where we can reflect your love and your light in the New Year. Grow our vision. Grow our awareness. Grow our imagination. Grow our

strength. Grow our confidence.

Help us to see each other, Lord. Help us to see ourselves and all that we have to offer.

There was a beautiful energy that surfaced inside the Sewickley United Methodist Church as the challenges in 2020 persisted. We looked for new ways to give and share and connect. We were innovative. We delivered meals. We filled shoeboxes. We provided coats. We remembered nurses. We shared worship in new ways. We prayed. We contributed.

Let's ask God to sustain and grow and direct the energy and imagination we have as a church family.

We can pray into all the challenges we face as a church, a community and a nation. But let's also ask to be part of the solution, and then listen for His response.
