According to the website <u>Knowing Jesus</u>, the Bible refers to food 1,207 times. Jesus on multiple occasions refers to himself as the Bread of Life. We can read a couple of different stories that involve Jesus sitting down and eating with others. There is something holy and mysterious about sharing a meal together that really has a way of inviting others into our lives. There is a new(ish) song out called "Canyon" by Ellie Holcomb and one verse in particular sums up well the power of eating together:

I walked into the desert and I found You

You set a table for me

In the presence of my enemies, to share with my enemies

NO LONGER MY ENEMIES, NO LONGER MY ENEMIES

NO LONGER MY ENEMIES

I love the transition this song makes from having a tough time with people, to eating together with people, to a renewed relationship steeped in positivity and love. This is what sharing a meal with someone can accomplish. Jesus knew fellowship together around food can accomplish a lot of good things!

Well, that is no less true today then it was in Jesus' day. In the United Methodist Church there is a joke, "where two or more United Methodist are gathered there is food among them." Potlucks, fundraisers, meals to the sick, meals-on-wheels, dinner meetings, lunch meetings, only meetings with food are worth attending... you name it and food has been a very important part of our life together. Here in this church we have raised a significant amount of money to help pay down the Building of Faith (sanctuary renovation) loan by selling soup and hummus. We have monthly luncheons that go toward our General Fund. Not only has food been a significant way to raise funds, but it has also been a common part of our fellowship together. We have had Lenten dinners with other churches in our community, celebrated summer with a picnic, and pre-pandemic had drinks and snacks present as a way to gather people between our two services together.

I know that many of us are feeling disconnected from one another. I would invite you then to seize the opportunity to connect with one another again by supporting these programs. Sit down together as often as you can and as is safe concerning Covid for you and your family and break bread with one another. Let's heal what feels as though it has been broken over the past year and a half and let's eat together. If you have not yet signed up for a Porch Party please consider doing so, there isn't a whole meal but there is food! Maybe we aren't enemies, but let's be really good neighbors and really good friends by sharing our table with one another. Amen!



CHALLENGING THE SCHOOL TO PRISON PIPELINE

Saturday, October 9, 9am-4pm (8:30am Registration & Breakfast) Christ United Methodist Church, 44 Highland Ave., Bethel Park



The school-to-prison pipeline is a disturbing national trend wherein students are funneled out of public schools and into the juvenile and criminal justice systems for minor infractions of school rules. The key policies and practices that created and now maintain the school-to-prison pipeline include zero tolerance policies, and the presence of police on campus as school resource officers (SROs). Once students are put into contact with law enforcement for disciplinary reasons many are then pushed out of the educational environment and into the juvenile and criminal justice systems. Students of color are especially vulnerable to push-out trends and the discriminatory application of discipline.

"Christmas in July" wonderfully accelerated our 2021 Operation Christmas Child campaign, but we need to keep the spirit of Christmas alive through September and October to share the Love of Jesus with children around the world.

We placed a Christmas tree at the front of the SUMC sanctuary for the July 25 services and asked church family to place donations for our 2021 Operation Christmas Child campaign beneath the tree. The results were astounding. Thank you!

We collected 50 pencil sharpeners, more than 40 notebooks, 31 boxes of colored pencils, 32 boxes of crayons and 21 boxes of markers. We also gathered erasers, glue sticks, scissors and metric-edged rulers. There were toothbrushes and adhesive bandages, socks and sunglasses, dinosaurs and toy cars, balls and hair accessories, and "wow" gifts.

In our 11th season, after sending more than 1,000 shoeboxes to the world's children, the SUMC family continues to demonstrate a passion for sharing Christmas and Jesus with His children. The OCC team is encouraged and strengthened by your spirit. Thank you!

September will be our final formal month of seeking contributions for the 2021 OCC boxes. Together, we have packed at least 100 boxes in each of the past nine years. Kara and daughters Elliett and Evarett have gloriously wrapped 80 shoeboxes in Christmas paper for our 2021 campaign.

To fill those boxes, we still have needs:

- Toothbrushes would be our greatest need. Since we launched in 2011, we have packed a toothbrush in every box.
- School supplies are always welcomed, and scissors, glue sticks and pens are our greatest needs as we enter September.
- We also include special gifts in every box, and T-shirts, socks, sunglasses, jewelry, hair accessories, balls, dolls, stuffed animals and toys help make the boxes special.

Details for packing events in October will be finalized and publicized in September. The boxes must be packed and delivered to collection sites in early November.


