

EDUCATION NEWS FOR THE NEW PROGRAMMING YEAR

 All parents are invited to a meeting on September 11 after church at noon in the Simpson Room to discuss Christian Education for the children and youth. We seek your input and assistance.



- Children's Church will be held during both the 9 am and 11 am services immediately after the Children's Message. There will not be any children's classes between 10-11 am.
 - Children's Church will start on September 11th.
 - Our teaching efforts will focus on the use of the Bible, as age-appropriate, videos, storytelling, and take-home pages. We are exploring new curriculums, computer-based teaching, and additional videos for future use.
 - During the 9 am service, we hope to have 2 groups, for children aged 3— first grade and second through fifth grade. This will depend on the number of children attending.
 - For the 11 AM time, 4-year-olds through fifth graders are welcome to attend Children's Church.
- Ideas for Middle and High School Youth
 - Currently there is no formal Youth program, but the Education Team believes the youth would respond to youth events.
 Working with the parents, the Education Team will plan several "starter" events to get the effort going and then seek input from youth and parents. Parents, consider supporting this effort.
 - We need at least 2 people to commit to Youth Leadership.

Message: "Jesus Said What?"

Before we move on to "The Bible Said What?" we have a bonus "Jesus Said What?" message. As we take a look back at the law and the prophets through the lens of Jesus, it is important to understand how Jesus relates to them. Just as Jesus serves as the bridge between us and heaven, Jesus also serves as the bridge between the New Covenant Jesus established with us and the Covenant God established with the Israelites. Jesus did not come to abolish all that was, but to fulfill it. How is Jesus the fulfillment of the way things were and the newness of the way things should be?

Scripture Lesson: 1 Corinthians 14:26-40
Message: "The Bible Said What?"

After losing her campaign to become the first woman president Hillary Clinton said, "To all the little girls who are watching this, never doubt that you are valuable and powerful and deserving of every chance and opportunity in the world to pursue and achieve your own dreams." My 7-year-old daughter read this quote the other day in a book that tells stories about courageous women in our world and she said, "I want to be President someday." To which I responded, "You can be anything you want to be." However, when we read scripture together, I have to dance around passages that tell her she cannot be anything she wants to be unless she first gets permission from her husband. "The Bible Says What?" Are women really meant to be quiet in worship; are they really meant to cover their heads; were they really created to be submissive to their husbands? What does the Bible really say about these rightfully alarming passages that, when used wrongly, stunt the growth and potential of the women in our world?

Message: "The Bible Said What?"

In this week's message of "The Bible Said What?" we will take a look at what seems to be permission to own slaves and a commandment for those slaves to be obedient to their masters. Though slavery has been abolished in our nation, some still seek to force others to live under the system of oppression that harmfully using this scripture has built up in our nation. The Bible clearly upholds the structure of master and slave, so how is that scripture meant to speak to us today?

Message: "The Bible Said What?"

As I take a look at the theme of scriptures that is most concerning to people it is one in which a certain group of people are being held to a standard that not all groups of people are being held to. It is a theme in which there seems to be some permission given to withhold people from living into who they have been created to be. In this week's "The Bible Said What?" message we will look at what the Bible really says about homosexuality. And not only will we find a truth that rises above the harmful rhetoric that makes love an object of hell but we will find a deeper truth that helps us understand just how beautiful and awesome the Bible is and God created us to be.

SOUP & HUMMUS SALE STARTS 7TH



I look forward to sharing fall with all of you and joining you in more opportunities to serve and love and grow.







We have an Operation Christmas Child packing party planned for the morning of September 25. All are welcome to join in the packing fun. The Children's Church kids will lead the way, but there will be

work for everyone. We will begin at 9 am and continue until all the boxes are packed. Join us between or after worship services.

We have plenty of crayons and markers, pens and pencils, erasers and sharpeners, sunglasses and socks, washcloths and toothbrushes, and stuffed animals. We're thankful to all who have contributed.

And we have a few needs, if you're looking to contribute, by September 25. We need more scissors, glue sticks, rulers (with a metric edge), notebooks, tissues, adhesive bandages, combs and brushes.

We could use a few more "wow" gifts like small balls and cars, jewelry, bandanas, ball caps, yo-yos, jump ropes, T-shirts and flip-flops.

We also accept financial donations, to complete our shopping needs and to cover shipping costs. The shipping price has jumped to \$10 per box this year.

This is the 12th year the Fellowship of the Cross has led an OCC drive at SUMC. We have shipped more than 1,100 boxes to



children in Honduras, the Dominican Republic, Ukraine, Columbia, the Bahamas and several nations in Africa.

As we enter the final month of our Operation Christmas Child campaign, consider this note from Olesea, who was 5 and living in Moldova (a nation snuggled

between Ukraine and Romania) when she received her shoebox.

"The thing that stood out to me the most was a pack of colorful markers. I couldn't take my eyes off them. There were so many in the pack! I didn't know some of the colors existed," Olesea, now a nurse, said in testimony posted on the OCC website.

"I was so excited I jumped up and started running around the room ... I always wished I could color and draw—the markers were exactly what I wanted. I could hardly wait to show my friends at school the new markers.

"I began a personal relationship with Jesus. He became real to me. The day I received my shoebox I went from knowing about Jesus to actually knowing Him. I began a personal relationship with Jesus — one where He is my Best Friend — instead of just a powerful Man I'd heard about during Sunday School.

"God used my shoebox to reassure me that He really loved me. It showed me that God does answer prayer. God became real and personal to me."

So, I considered asking Pastor Hannah or one of my trusted Methodist sources for insight, but instead I Googled it.


From an Internet dictionary, I found this explanation: "In liturgical Protestant churches,
